Dear Families of RHS Seniors:

Again this year, the Reach High Scholars Program and Academic Approach will be conducting **SAT Prep Classes at RHS for seniors on five Saturdays, leading up to the SAT I Test on Nov. 5<sup>th</sup>, which this year will be offered at RHS.** On Sept. 24<sup>th</sup>, there will be a full SAT practice test from 8:30 AM until noon, with the results available to students by October 7<sup>th</sup>. On Oct. 8<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>, the classes will start at 8:00 and end by 10:00. Each session will have two 50-minute classes.

#### The New PSAT and SAT Tests

The PSAT and SAT Tests were revised last year to correspond with high school curriculums and better reflect what students have learned. The PSAT and SAT tests use similar types of questions and each of the two sections, Math and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing, are scored on the same 200-to-800 scale, thus enabling students and educators to track progress. The essay required in the past is now optional and scored separately.

The revised tests draw heavily from the Common Core math and reading benchmarks adopted by most states, including NH. The tests emphasize evidence-based interpretation of texts, vocabulary used in colleges and careers and depth-over-breadth math skills. By focusing on higher-level logic and reasoning, they are more relevant to college success and everyday life.

The NH Department of Education now uses the new SAT as the statewide assessment to meet federal requirements and to compare NH high schools. Good test results by RHS students will move the school up in the rankings, which can have positive impacts on the attitude of college admissions offices toward RHS applicants, the ability to hire and retain good teachers, local real estate values and the general morale in the school and community. To help RHS's cause, RHSP provides the most extensive on-site PSAT and SAT Prep of any high school in New Hampshire.

### **Importance of Preparation**

The SAT tests are common-denominator measurements of all applicants to U.S. colleges. For RHS students, they are a way to show that you are "as good as the next guy," who often has prepared with classroom courses or private tutoring of 20 weeks or more, at a cost of \$1,200 to well over \$5,000.

Colleges use SAT scores to interpret the academic challenge of a student's high school courses and to assess the potential for success in college. Good scores can help students to gain access to top colleges with significant need-based financial aid and to qualify for merit scholarships.

It is recommended that students take the SAT at least twice, with continual preparation throughout the process. Most colleges "Super Score" students' SAT results by accepting the best score on each section of the test, regardless of the date on which it was achieved.

SAT I tests will be given this fall on Oct. 1st, Nov. 5th and Dec. 3rd. Because of the Labor Day and RHS Homecoming Weekends, it is not possible to do an adequate prep course before October 1st. Hence, seniors are recommended to take SAT II Subject Tests that day and do the SAT I Test on one or both of the later dates, after they have had adequate preparation.

#### **Permission to Receive Scores**

As part of the college preparation process, Academic Approach continually monitors the progress of students and the construct of its lessons by reviewing the trend of scores on the Diagnostic Tests and students' scores on Official SAT Tests.

RHS receives the official scores from College Board for each student and can provide them to RHSP and Academic Approach with your permission. Authorization for this is provided on the Application Form.
